<u>Guest Speaker:</u> Richard Tucker: Sailing around Tasmania

- VDL-C Cruise held every two years to coincide with the Australian Wooden Boat Festival.
- Starts from Hobart anti-clockwise around Tasmania, approximately 800 nautical Miles
- Tamar Yacht Club joined Marni February 21st.
- Georgetown to Devonport (30nM / 5.5kts) The Bolter
- Devonport Mersey River. Spirit of Tasmania ferry terminal.
- Devonport to Stanley (56nM / 6.2kts)
- Stanley tight entrance to fishing port
- The Nut Cable car and zig-zag path, good views, mutton bird burrows
- Hunter group of islands (Hunter, Three Hummocks & Robbins (home of the annual Saltwater Muster).
- Islands for sale (Waterhouse and Ninth Island (very small). Only nine islands around Tasmania are freehold. Prospective Chinese purchasers.
- Three Hummock Island to Pilot Bay entrance to Macquarie Harbour (125nM / 7.25kts)
- Rocky coastline and islands giving way to massive sand dunes and isolated beaches. Albatross Island home of the only breeding species of albatross within Australia (Shy Alabatross). Entered Macquarie Harbour via Hells Gate at dawn. Perfectly calm, shallow bar. Normally 3m – 4m swells.
- Arrived Strahan (Risby Cove), first boat of cruising fleet - Lunched on scallop pies from Banjo's Bakery.
- Macquarie Harbour approximately 35km x 9km.
 Western side almost exclusively salmon fishery pens
- Gordon River navigable by yacht for 17 miles.
- Clear skies at night, no light pollution and absolute silence.
- Kayak trip to confluence of Franklin and Gordon rivers.
- Northern Mount Lyell Mining and Railway Co. Railway follows Bird River and on up to mines at Queenstown.
- West Coast Wilderness Railway (Strahan to Queenstown). Abt rack and pinion system invented by Swiss engineer Carl Abt.
- Railway follows King River, cut into side of valley. Ore originally shipped out in flat-bottomed barges from river port of Teepookana prior to construction of railway.
- Last day in Strahan before crew change on 7Mar
