- 3. B Willis presented her first Rotary Spot, telling us a little about herself. She has a history of community involvement mainly with sports teams and her job as an occupational therapist. She came to work at Carinya 18 months ago, where she met Josie. At first, she struggled with how to fit into our club, feeling somewhat lost for a while. Gradually she became energised and now feels she has found her place.
- 4. G Goode reminded us of dates for the Art Show.
- 5. D Dunstan and Peter Lisman have completed painting and branding rubbish bins at showgrounds.
- 6. G Waldhuter said that Probus and Argus bbqs were successful. RYDA is rolling smoothly along. International Dinner coming together.
- 7. D Dunstan introduced DieterSyder who is doing a lap of Australia on his motorbike as one of the International Fellowship of Motorcycle Rotarians. It has taken him 9 months to arrive in Clare from Germany. His passion is motorbiking and raising awareness of mental illness and suicide prevention, having lost his own son by suicide w years ago. He always feels at home at any Rotary club in the world.
- 8. Guest Speaker Cheryl talked about "Wheels in Motion". Young people in rural towns need driving licence to get a job. After their Ls, they need to clock up 75 hours of driving with another licenced driver. Employment Directions provide the car, but need volunteers to sit as passenger. Wheels in Motion commenced 7 years ago in Gawler. The cost of going through by log book method is from \$75 to \$115 per lesson. Mentors put up timed available on the website, and the young people book online. 2 hour sessions usually at dusk on dirt roads. A Toyota Corolla has been assigned by Employment Directions for the Clare program. Volunteers and financial assistance to pay for instructors and car running costs are needed from Rotary.
- 9. Thursday March 21st; "Let's Talk" bicycle riders arrive in Clare. BBQ tea begins 5.30 pm, followed by a talk.
- 10. Mon 29th April Past Members evening at Rotary Centre.
- 11. Josie is looking for potential host families for an incoming exchange student for 2019/2020.
