Note ; The Children's Centre next to the high school is already doing this, but no reason for us not to do it as well. 8. Group 9 meeting went well. 9. Guest Speakers: David and Wendy Spackman are members of the Toyota Landcruiser Club. They took it on mainly to assist with the maintenance of Innaminka Regional Reserve. The work consists of a two week working bee every July. They provide their own accommodation. 10 to 30 people take part. There is 1.3 million hectares of reserve, holding beef cattle grazing and oil and gas fields. There are plenty of camping sites. The reserve is managed by two rangers. They provide the volunteer group with a list of jobs to be done –recording bird sightings, gardening and repairs around headquarters. Spring cleaning, repainting, fencing, general tidying and rubbish removal. Cemetery has been ongoing project. They also document ruins and artifacts. After Innaminka, they spend 5 days at Bimbowrie Conservation Park, replacing concrete repairs to old stone buildings with lime mortar. The talk was followed by a slide show. Very interesting – although hard work, the benefits are good for the mind and body, making new friends and also having fun. Better use of a Toyota Landcruiser than clogging up the Woolies carpark!
