 9. Treasurer Stephen advised that 3 members are still to pay dues, and two have paid twice.
 10. Glen advised that three students have nominated for NYSF next year – 2 from CHS and one from Balaklava.
 11. He thanked all who have offered to join the Board in his next year as President.
 12. David Dunstan reported that work at Neagles Rock is under way – painting and repairs. Ian Howlett suggested that the club pick up some more remedial work on the site e.g. signs and rubbish, as Council does not support in this way.
 13. We watched a presentation from the last E Conference by the Clontarff Foundation, a group which strives to support education, discipline and self esteem of aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young men. It started in 2000, using football as an attractor. Funding comes from State, Federal and private in equal measure. Started in WA, then NT, Vic, NSW, Qld and SA. In 2020, 9,000 students participated. It puts up positive role models for the young men, and tries to make school attractive through positive attitudes, assisting with employment/further education. Also plays mentoring role, camps and connection with family. Outcomes have been very encouraging – 90% retention and 80% attendance at school, many year 12 graduations. Very interesting and positive story.
