Speakers	lan Palmer

- 1. After opening the meeting, David Dunstan introduced Guest Speaker Ian Palmer, a petroleum engineer with a PHD studying cosmic rays from the sun. He grew up in Jamestown but now lives in the USA. He spoke to us about "fracking", which is short for "hydraulic fracturing" This method extracts oil and natural gas from shale layers. Shale is a soft rock which becomes sticky when wet due to its clay content. It contains organic material, which has become oil and natural gas over time. Shale is very impermeable. Fracking pumps water, containing sand and acidic chemicals, under high pressure to crack the shale. The first commercial shale well opened in 2003. Recent wells have been fracked 40 times, using 20 million gallons of fresh water over 4 hours. This accounts for 1% of Mexico's water. 10 million kgs of sand is used. Fracking can initiate earthquakes - before 2009, Oklahoma had one earthquake per year. This rose to 900 over 10 years. Oil companies are coming around to accepting transition from fossil fuels. Natural gas and oil from shale is very cheap compared to rising imported oil prices (to USA). The Delaware basin in southern New Mexico and West Texas is the biggest deposit of shale ever discovered. However, the shale deposits will last only 20 years. Ian has written a novel called "Fracman Conflicted" It is a "scientific romance." Thanks for an unbiased and straightforward explanation, lan.
