Guest Speakers	David Egan (DG) & David Cockshell (Chair DIK)

1. Pres Josie thanked and congratulated Rotarians for the past few weeks of hard work. She advised there are still some jobs to be filled.
2. Josie reminded that Annual Reports are needed for presentation at Changeover.
3. Jim Michael thanked Stephen Freeman for Kilikanoon wine donation for International Dinner on Sunday 16th June.
4. David Egan – DG visiting clubs in district prior to handover. 40 current clubs in district, still 19 to visit. There will be 90 clubs when districts combine and feels it will be a challenge for incoming DG to visit all clubs. He reported that he has good memories of visiting Clare over the years. He acknowledged David Cockshell for his management of DIK RAH project. David pleased Pres Josie continuing for another year with her good work. He quoted Mark Maloney (incoming RI President) – don't measure outcomes in the 1 year as it can take years for them to come about.
5. David Cockshell – Chair DIK presented on RAH surplus equipment. The longest single Rotary project in South Aust. David took 18 months from his employment to manage the project. There were 7393 medical items that went overseas at value of \$3.4 million in 28 containers to 21 countries. Rotary selected for project as Rotary name trusted, RAWCS governance experience, ability to manage projects dealing with lots of interested groups and experience with shipping. Considerable effort and liaison to create governance process and MUA for goods to be shipped. Took all of 2017 to identify items. 594 biomedical items with 22,000 requests for them. David advised he literally rolled a dice to allocate items to these requests. 6800 non-biomedical items – 2060 dental boxes, 103 pallets of consumables. Loading of containers occurred between 25th Jan to 25th March 2018. Sponsors paid for shipping. David has been to Nepal and Fiji with containers to see first hand shipping and delivery outcomes. Apart from RAH project in past 7 years DIK has sent approx. 10 containers. D Rogers related experience in PNG where some containers were not cleared due to paperwork, goods not being collected and items did not have ongoing supplies. David responded that the comprehensive governance process hopefully established means items were sustainable; such as ensuring goods appropriate, available technicians, access to spare parts, facilities to accommodate items. He is currently collating reports from each project with the aim to finalise the project soon.
6. Pres Josie thanked David Cockshell for an interesting talk. She advised that Clare had an interesting visit to DIK on 18th August 208.
