Funds to support 2020 school supplies and building works in Cambodia - B Singleton – Photos in Plains Producer this week from changeover - H Weber – still some white wine left for purchase - Allen Mayfield provided great insight into updating of Interpretive signs on the Riesling Trail supported by Rotary grants. 75,000 uses of trail as identified by Infra red trackers. 4 Interpretive signs, one at Watervale, Auburn, Leasingham and Penwortham are priority to upgrade due to current poor location and sun exposure. Signs to be updated with info and photos. Other future works on trail include; - Completion of trail in Auburn to start of Rattler trail at cost of \$320,000. Funding from Federal govt, wine makers, trail committee and Geoff Brock with possible opening in October 2019. 3 meter Archway over trail at start. J Pulford contributing to artwork on archway - Upgrading location maps - Solar lights placed 1 ½ km along trail by Riesling cabins - Widen quarry bridge and upgrade culverts - Allen Mayfield gave brief overview of recent opening of Lions 2nd hand furniture project. Plan to operate for 6 months with aim to continue if successful. Open all day Fridays and Sat mornings. Able to collect and deliver locally. Good patronage to date. Keen for volunteers to assist to help with sales in the shop. - Pres Josie and members thanked Allen for informative and enlightening talk - Pres Josie advised need 25 member/partners for social meeting on Mon 29th at Clare Central Motel, 6 for 6.30 \$20pp, bar available. - Pres Josie advised of upcoming conferences: 9520 - 27th-29th March 2020 in Mildura, 9500 – 3-5th April 2020 in Whyalla
