Guest Speaker Kathy Anderson from the Corner Patch fruit and vegetable shop. She and her husband Darrel, their daughter Monique and son in law Jason all work in the business. They moved from Blackwood when they took over the business in February 2018. Kathy has family connections with Clare, but no experience with fruit and veg. The existing staff was retained, and they were of great assistance while the new owners learned the ropes. After nearly two years, and a slow start. Things are improving. They are enjoying the country lifestyle very much, appreciating having more room to move. They have purchased their own truck, which they take to market in Adelaide twice a week, leaving in the small hours of the morning. They quite enjoy the drive while nobody else is on the road. They have many local wholesale customers. Once they have purchased a suitable delivery vehicle, they will be offering home deliveries. There is very little produce wasted – slightly damaged fruit and veg can still be sold for juicing, with no loss of quality. Any excess ends up as animal feed or compost. They encourage customers to reject plastic, and allow them to use their own eco bags. The remaining problem waste is waked cardboard and polystyrene boxes, which cannot be recycled. They give these away to anyone who can use them. It was interesting to hear about a small business in our main street, especially one that is beginning to thrive, when other retail businesses are struggling.
