- Guest Speaker: Jeremy Scott spoke about his 2 ½ year bicycle ride from London to Auckland. AT 2 days old, he was diagnosed with a hole in the heart and a faulty aortic valve. The surgeon wanted to wait until he was older, but by 4 years of age, Jeremy was very ill. The eventual operation gave him a normal life. As an adult living in London, he decided to undertake the ride to raise money for charity. He was very unfit at the beginning, so broke his journey into small sections, becoming fit along the way. It took him 10 weeks to cycle across Europe, then through Iran and Central Asia. Apart from one scary episode in Iran, he found people's hospitality exceptional. From Western China he endured heat and sandstorms in SE Asia, then down the Eastern coast of Australia. He finished his ride in Auckland. The whole trip was self funded from his savings made in London. He was able to survive on very little money, and only what he could carry on his bike, living an extremely minimalist life. He has had his photos and story published in a beautiful coffee table book, copies of which were for sale after the meeting. Thanks Jeremy for a very awe inspiring address.
