- Kate Bartholomaeus advised that the Combined Services meeting will be on Mon 16<sup>th</sup> March. Sevenhill CWA is invited for the first time. Apex is organising the dinner.
- Guest Speakers Susanne and Tim spoke about Helping Hands in Bhutan. Susanne is originally an occupational therapist who worked in burns units in UK and USA. She was one of Australia's first hand therapists. She also lectures at UniSA. She has been associated with Bhutan for many years. Timothy is head of plastic surgery at QEH, and also lectures. He is the Country Coordinator for the Bhutan project. Bhutan is a small country in south central Asia. They have a measure of Gross Domestic Happiness. Population 800,000, with a king and queen. Hand injuries are common due to manual work, burns, bears, trauma and congenital abnormalities. 11 years ago there were no plastic surgeons or therapists in the country. The program is made sustainable by training and mentoring local doctors. There are now 2 hand therapy clinics. Tim began his medical career with GP training in Clare. He showed us several images of surgical treatments, e.g cleft lip/palate repairs, congenital defect correction and burn contraction releases done in Bhutan. He has made 8 trips since May 2015. Future plans are to train a Bhutanese surgeon commencing Feb 2020 in India and 2021 in Adelaide.
